

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# Agenda 2030

- Agenda 2030 «Transforming our World» adopted September 2015 (A/RES/70/1)
- New framework of SDGs replacing the MDGs
- System composed by 17 goals
- 169 targets
- and 221 global indicators



# Why is it important?

A **universal, holistic** approach

**Universal:** A “to-do” list for **everybody**, not only developing countries

**Holistic:** No goal can be achieved **without advancing on the others**

A road map to connecting multiple agendas (health, poverty, environment, education, gender, security, ...) for a **multiplier effect**

behind


Major **transformational** framework

Introduces concepts of **goals, targets and indicators** across the board: Evaluation challenge for all development aspects

**Data revolution:** more and better data for **universality, inclusiveness and integration** (data disaggregation by gender, age, ethnicity, etc)



# SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



## Goal 16 an unprecedented connection between peace, security and development

- *Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels*
- Security as a key feature of the agenda  
*‘Sustainable development cannot be realized without peace and security; and peace and security will be at risk without sustainable development’ (UNGA, 2015a, para. 35).*
- Broad language, a variety of targets
- Avoids the words ‘security’ or ‘safety’
- Links peace promotion to sustainable development.
- Requires a wide range of new specific indicators



# Peaceful and inclusive societies

- **Priorities**
  - Violence reduction
  - Integrity
  - Rule of law
  - Human Rights
- **Capacity**
  - Strong and accountable institutions

Freedom from want and fear

Elimination of violence against or exploitation of women and girls

Safeguards to protect personal security

Rule of law

Strengthen institutions

Fair justice systems

Fight corruption

Reduce illicit financial and arms flows

Combat money laundering and tax evasion

Recover stolen and hidden assets

Overcome state fragility

Support to refugees and internally displaced persons

Contribute to resilience of people and communities

Free, active and meaningful engagement of civil society

# HLPF 2021

- From 6 to 15 July 2021 (13-15 July Ministerial segment)
- The HLPF will review 9 SDGs in focus through meetings on:
  - Ending poverty and hunger and transforming towards inclusive and sustainable economies (SDGs 1, 2, 8, 17)
  - Transforming consumption and production and addressing and mitigating climate change (SDGs 12, 13, 17)
  - Building more peaceful, equal, and inclusive societies (SDGs 3, 10, 16, 17)
- 44 countries will be presenting VNRs (9 first timers, 25 second timers and 10 third timers).

## REVIEW MECHANISM FOR THE SDGs

- The High-level Political Forum (HLPF) is the UN central platform for follow-up and review of the SDGs
- It provides for the full and effective participation of all States Members of the UN and specialized agencies, with ample space for side events and a role for civil society.
- As stipulated in Agenda 2030, paragraphs 79 and 84, regular reviews by the HLPF are to be **voluntary, state-led, undertaken by both developed and developing countries**, and involve multiple stakeholders.

*Regular follow-up and review processes will be*

“rigorous and based on evidence, informed by country-led evaluations and data which is high-quality, accessible, timely, reliable and **disaggregated by income, sex, age, race, ethnicity, migration status, disability and geographic location** and other characteristics relevant in national contexts” (Agenda 2030, para 74 (g))

- Need for strengthened evaluation capacity in developing countries
- Equity & gender-responsive perspective



## Role for civil society

Ensure broad **dissemination** of the Agenda

Collective **knowledge** becomes actionable by different stakeholders, towards full implementation of the Agenda

Role of '**third parties**' in monitoring

- Complement, support
- Verify, validate
- Innovate, advance in methodology
- Ensure broad ownership of data
